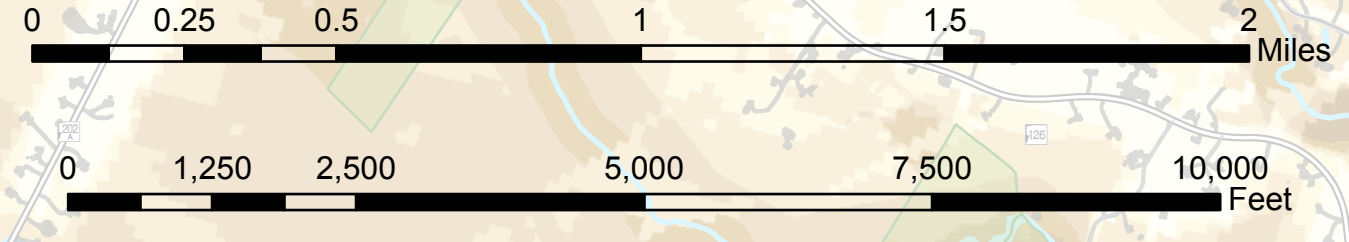

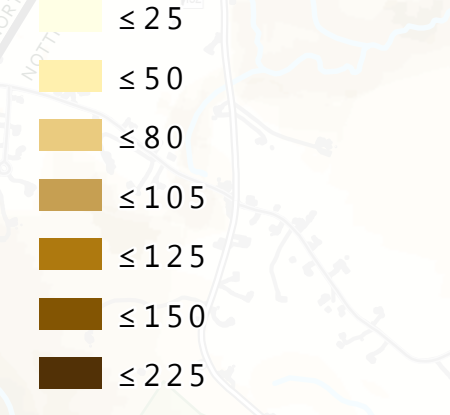


Conservation Opportunity Zones

- 1 West of Nippo Lake
- 2 Confluence of Nippo Brook and Insinglass River
- 3 South of Ayers and Long Ponds
- 4 Area around Round Pond
- 5 Scruton Pond and along the Insinglass River west of the Calef easement
- 6 Confluence of Mallego Brook and Wentworth Brook
- 7 Tributaries flowing into the Bellamy River

The co-occurrence map combines nine different natural resources criteria: soils, water resource areas, wetlands, wildlife, connectivity, conservation focus areas, other surface and groundwater resources, climate change resiliency, and connectivity to conserved areas. These were individually ranked with a weighted system and the resulting values summed to show areas of highest conservation value. The dark brown represents the highest values of co-occurrence.
